#### **GENERAL DESCRIPTION:**

Shiawassee Health & Wellness, an innovative community mental health organization, is seeking a full-time therapist to provide in-home therapeutic services, intensive outreach, and case management services as part of a treatment team, to children and families served by the SHW Children's Home-Based Program. This therapist reports to the Supervisor of Services for Children and Families, or to other supervisory staff as designated by the Chief Executive Officer.

#### **EDUCATION:**

Master's Degree in social work, clinical psychology, or other mental health related field from an accredited university.

#### **EXPERIENCE:**

Minimum of one year experience in the examination, evaluation, and treatment of minors and their families.

#### **CERTIFICATION/LICENSURE:**

Current requisite professional licensure. Certification in an evidence based practice or willingness to gain certification in an evidenced based practice.

#### **SUMMARY OF ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:**

- Provides family, individual, and other forms of therapy, as determined by the treatment plan, and assertive case management services on an out-reach basis as a member of the Children's Home-Based Team.
- Provides clinical assessments of children and families referred for Children's Home-Based services. Develops treatment plans and implements strategies in collaboration with the family and as part of the Children's Home-Based Team.
- Coordinates mental health services with those of other community agencies to prevent hospitalization and out-of-home placement, and to promote individual, family, and monitors, on an ongoing basis, service delivery to Children's Home-Based consumers and their families to determine effectiveness and appropriateness of those services and to

modify plans of services in response to changing needs.

- Maintains accurate and current documentation according to agency and third party reimbursement standards and established agency practices and time frames.
- Ability to work a flexible schedule, including weekends and evenings, as necessary to meet the needs of consumers and the agency.
- Provides 24-hour crisis intervention for department on a rotating basis which may include Mobile Crisis Intervention in the home, community, and hospital settings.
